

Tennessee affords me time to think about what to ask a man who has
already answered more than his fair share of relevant pipe questions.
For Edsel James is not simply a pipe collector or a salesman, he is an
endearing anachronism and reminder of a different time in our
cultural history. Known by many affectionate aliases such as
Mr. Dunhill, a curmudgeon, Captain Dot Head, and just plain ole
Edsel, he is a unique character in an industry in dire need of such.

Once initial salutations and formalities have been dispensed with, Edsel asks the inevitable question, "Have you ever been poor?" "Yes I have Edsel, I lived off a ten pound bag of potatoes for two weeks because that's all I had." "Well I guess you know" he replies as his



thoughts trail off to another subject. His patented question always requires a response.

In his immaculate den Edsel has assembled a significant pile of articles and magazines that feature editorials about him and Dunhill pipes.
