THE SASIENI PIPE-A TRADITION

IVE generations of the Sasieni family have devoted their talents to the fashioning of fine briar pipes. Into their experiments have gone a true understanding of pipes, pipe smoking and pipe smokers, and through this understanding they have gradually developed a technique in pipe making that is a real art.

Sasieni employs only the most skilled craftsmen in his factory and selects briar that is a century old.

In Algeria, the briar is dug out of the ground by natives and carried down the mountain slopes to sea-port towns. From there it is shipped to Sasieni in London. Each block is then carefully examined, but of every gross bought by Sasieni, an average of only four blocks suit his requirements. All others are discarded.

During the first seasoning process, the briar is dried out on racks for several months, so that only the blocks that have not developed flaws through this natural drying are sorted for size and shape.

Each block of briar has a distinct grain—impossible to duplicate as a person's fingerprints—and the trained eyes of Sasieni workers specify for these blocks the shape of bowl most suitable to their graining.

Fine briar deserves fine workmanship. Briar used in the Sasieni factory receives excellent and expensive treatment. The Sasieni pipe goes through a series of processes; seasoning cutting boring carving re-seasoning sandpapering staining polishing; and the discovery of flaws during each operation renders that briar useless.

For balance and weight . . for artistic proportions . . an appropriate vulcanite mouthpiece is fitted to the individual bowl, and the pipe is finally given a high polish by electrically run buffers. Then you have a perfect pipe—literally coaxed out of the wood—a pipe accurately balanced for comfort in the mouth . . . beautiful to the eye . . . delicious to the palate.

THE SASIENI SEASONING PROCESS




Mellowness from the first time a pipe is smoked has been the object for more than a quarter century of Sasieni experiments. At last, he evolved a means to eliminate the bitter saps and oils found so objectionable in the smoking of ordinary pipes.

Originally, briar was cured by placing it on pieces of glass and exposing it to the sun's rays for many weeks. The bowls were turned from week to week so that the sun might draw out the natural moisture from every surface of the briar. Many skilled manufacturers of pipes have attempted to reproduce this natural curing process, but only Sasieni has succeeded in giving his pipes the necessary heat without injury to the briar.

Through the secret patented Sasieni process, the blocks of briar are baked for six weeks in ovens of high and even temperature. Girls sit before the baking ovens, continually wiping away the moisture which is forced out of the wood by the heat and accumulates on the surface.

Only a perfect bowl can withstand the extreme heat of this process. A pipe that remains intact after six weeks' baking is assured of a long life, and has been mellowed to a point not attained by any other known process. Its pores are clean and dry, remaining open so that the full flavor of the briar may be tasted the first time a Sasieni pipe is smoked; and no sap remains to bite the tongue of the smoker.

The Sasieni pipe is truly sweet from the first puff.



The most beautiful pipe obtainable is a Sasieni straight grain briar its grain, the result of centuries of uninterrupted growth its mellowness the result of the intensive Sasieni baking process.

Ideal straight grain bowls are cut from the heart of large and extremely old briar roots. They are very rare because only one bowl may be obtained from a single root, and few roots are sufficiently free from flaws, or old enough, or parallel enough in their graining to meet the high Sasieni standards of perfection.

Unerring craftsmanship is necessary to extract a block from the center of a perfectly grained briar, and to shape a bowl of the size and proportions best adapted to the grain. Sasieni, over a period of years has been able to assemble a fine collection of these pipes. We would be pleased to submit, upon request, several of them for inspection.

THE SASIENI VIRGIN BRIAR

Many men prefer the golden color of the virgin briar. For this reason, Sasieni selects bowls to be highly polished and left unstained. The Sasieni polishing merely brings out the true beauty of the virgin briar and increases the rich quality of its grain.

Like all Sasieni pipes, the Virgin Briar is subjected to the complete baking process, through which is developed an unparalleled mellowness.

THE SASIENI RUSTIC BRIAR



Sasieni Rustic Briar pipes undergo the same process essential to the making of all Sasieni pipes. After they have been put through the six weeks' seasoning process, each of these pipes is hand carved to bring out in relief the natural grain of the wood. The shape of the bowl remains the same; but as no two woods are alike, the pattern of each Rustic Briar is unique—and each is a true work of art.

Only a perfect bowl could survive both the intensive heat of the Sasieni seasoning process and the deep carving of the rustic effect. When the high polish has been given the rustic briar, there results a pipe perfectly seasoned, cool, light in the mouth, perfect in finish—and durable.

THE SASIENI PATENTED EXTENSION



Sasieni is the originator of the ball-cleaner pipe-extension; it is a true self-cleaning device. Although there have been many attempts to copy it, this cleaner has never been duplicated, due to the great expense involved in hand-fitting.

The extension is non-corrosive and is moulded to the mouthpiece, so that it forms a definite part of the pipe. It is fitted by hand to the length and width of the shank, and the ball itself makes an air-tight joint with the shank walls and tobacco bore. It is absolutely hygienic, and prevents all tobacco crumbs, dust, and liquids from reaching the mouth of the smoker. It traps the saliva in the stem chamber and is easily cleaned with a Sasieni Drymore Pipe Cleaner.

This extension is fitted to all Sasieni Pipes, and affords a perfect system of ventilation in every Sasieni model.

The Sasieni Buddy Pouch provides a place for the tobacco and a place for the pipe, all in one case. It is sanitary, compact, fits any pocket, and entirely eliminates pipe odors from the clothing.

The tobacco section expands at both ends and the bottom, permitting the tobacco to spread evenly. This eliminates bulky bulges found in other pouches and has a capacity of two ounces of tobacco.

SASIENI CIGARETTE HOLDERS



The same accuracy, workmanship and materials that characterize the Sasieni pipes are also embodied in every Sasieni cigarette holder. They are equipped with a miniature ball-cleaner extension which assures the smoker of a cool, clean smoke.

Sasieni cigarette holders are packed individually in Velvet Calf Skin cases and are obtainable in the following styles:

HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR SASIENI PIPE

Your enjoyment of the Sasieni pipe will increase with its age—but remember that you are the owner of the world's premier pipe, and if you would have it long-lived, increasing in friendliness toward you, treat it kindly. The Sasieni pipe is so true in its manufacture and so accurate in its proportions that it will never crack or burn out if properly cared for.

The Sasieni pipe needs no "breaking in." The six weeks of special seasoning takes the place of a hundred days of smoking. It is sweet from the start.

SMOKING THE SASIENI PIPE.

The first time you smoke a Sasieni pipe, dampen the bowl. Pack it to the top with good tobacco, loosely at the bottom—but more firmly at the top, and especially around the edges—so that an even draft may be created.

Then start to smoke, and smoke it from top to heel for the first few times at least, so that you will obtain an even cake. A pipe that has formed the habit of remaining lighted until all tobacco is burned will not go out unexpectedly, whereas irregularities in the cake might cause this to occur. The Sasieni pipe-bowl is as smooth on the interior as outside, which helps to insure an even cake.

The cake is a porous accumulation of carbon that enables the tobacco to blend smoothly with the flavor of the briar, but it is important to keep it of an even thickness so that no portion of the wood may be over-heated. It is desirable to develop a cake, both to protect the wood and to achieve a rich flavor, but an excessive amount of carbon may cause the bowl to crack. Fifty per cent of burnt-out pipes are caused by improper removal of the cake, and Sasieni will gladly have it removed scientifically. When the cake in your pipe is an eighth inch in thickness, send your pipe to Sasieni's New York office to have the excessive cake removed free of charge.

. When first smoking the pipe, take long slow "drags" to prevent scorching the wood before the cake appears; taking the pipe from your mouth while exhaling will not only help to cool the bowl, but give you a cooler smoke as well.

After smoking, remove the ash immediately, using a blunt instrument such as a pencil to free the ash. With the forefinger on the bottom of the bowl and shank to keep from cracking them, tap the bowl lightly on the palm of your hand. Never run the risk of injuring your pipe by knocking it against a hard object.

CLEANING THE SASIENI PIPE

The pipe should be thoroughly cooled before the vulcanite mouthpiece is removed, as there is combustion and expansion, and unless the pipe is allowed to cool, there is danger of the shank cracking when mouthpiece is removed.

To clean the shank, it is wise to use the Sasieni Drymore Pipe Cleaners, which are of heavy texture and will absorb moisture more rapidly than other cleaners. If you will occasionally fold a Sasieni Drymore Pipe Cleaner in half and leave it in the shank overnight, you will be assured of a clean shank in the morning.

In order to obtain the finest flavor from your Sasieni pipe, it is advisable to allow your pipe to be completely cool before refilling. The pores of the briar can absorb only a certain amount of moisture at one time, and a rest will prevent your pipe from becoming soggy.

The veteran smoker owns many pipes. He appreciates the rich briar flavor that is sweetened by frequent rests for his pipes. he feels the need of different styles and shapes of pipes for his various moods and different occupations. he enjoys the companionship of the distinct personalities that develops in each fine briar pipe.

THE SASIENI GUARANTEE

Should the bowl of a Sasieni pipe crack or burn out within one year from the date of purchase, a new pipe will be given in exchange.

For repairs made necessary by any other cause such as broken or cracked shanks or broken mouthpieces a moderate charge will be made.

A pipe once replaced cannot be again exchanged.

It is our desire that all Sasieni smokers receive absolute satisfaction.
