

The Male Look - and Pipe Smoking

Since prehistoric times, when man-the-hunter clothed himself in skins of animals slain with spear and club, he has found comfort in his pipe. Huddled in caves, around open-pit cooking fires, he puffed on a crudely carved stone pipe.

So prized was this pipe, carved to glorify his gods of hunt and battle, that when he died it was buried with him, alongside his precious spear, club and cutting edge.

Centuries have passed. Customs have changed. But the pipe remains without question—the symbol of the masculine male.

This stone pipe was made by pre-historic American Indians who settled in what is now Tennessee, Original is in the Museum of American Indian, New

York City.

#### Special Shape Chart



For example if you want a "Flame Grain", simply pick out your shape preference by number and name. The same procedure can be followed with any other price line. Originals, Chesterfield, Colt and Campus are available only in certain specified shapes listed with the description of the pipes. Fine-Line. Signet and Silhouette should be ordered by general description only, i.e. Medium Apple, Large Billiard, etc.

#### All Kaywoodie Briar is imported

(but not all imported briar meets Kaywoodie specifications as you'll see).

Dotting the sandy soil of mountain slopes, ringing the Mediterranean Sea, is a small, scraggly bush called White Heather (Erica Arborea). When this homely plant has seen five or so summers, a small fibrous growth starts forming just above the roots. After many centuries of continuous growth (sometimes 3 to 4 feet in diameter) the Burl reaches maturity and is ready to be harvested—or dug out of the ground.


However, age alone is no guarantee that the briar Burl will eventually gain the coveted Kaywoodie cloverleaf. Just as there can be a vast difference between two pieces of (imported) briar growing side by side — there can be an even greater quality difference between two pieces of quality aged Burl. That's why age is just the first of many stringent requisites demanded by the keeneyed Kaywoodie briar buyer.


Hardness of fibre, clarity of grain, density of grain, closeness of grain all of these things must be examined, evaluated, and then accepted or rejected in terms of Kaywoodie's uncompromising, unsurpassed, standards. Because these are the all-important qualities that are necessary to provide the sweet, cool smoke that have become synonymous with the name Kaywoodie.

But the very qualities that make it worthy of the Kaywoodie seal - hard, dense, close, clear grain-automatically limit the quantity available each year. First, this choice briar can only be grown in sun-baked dry soil. And this dry, sandy soil strangles all but a few of the very hardiest plants.

Secondly, the trunk of the briar bush runs through the Burl to the roots, so that a large portion of the Burl is immediately cut away and discarded. Of the remaining Burl, only about 10%, the very "heart" of the Burl, qualifies as Kaywoodie Briar.

It is for these reasons you may not have been able to get all the Kaywoodie pipes you might like for yourself or for gifts. The supply of Kaywoodie pipes is always limited by the available supply of top-quality briar.





# Some pipes can be rushed through in 50 steps, but...


It takes 128 separate skilled operations (plus dozens of inspections) to make a Kaywoodie.

After 200 to 400 years of growing, two more years of seasoning and curing, 128 steps and dozens of inspections later, your pipe gets the Kaywoodie stamp of approval. No wonder Kaywoodie is the recognized standard of "Male Look" pipesmanship. KAYWOODIE

This rare cut of briar is "squared-up" on four sides, one of the first operations in making a Kaywoodie.

Only the "heart of the briar" is used. The reason Kaywoodie Pipes cake so quickly is the special seasoning process that takes only the "heart" of the finest briar and stretches the pores of this "prime cut" to absorb heat and hence, carbonize more quickly.

In 1851, Kaywoodie craftsmen founded an industry in the United States-and transformed it into an art.



Top Turning - Top of pipe bowl is "turned" and tobacco channel is reamed at the same time. The first shaping operation in pipe making.



Frazing-The type of pipe, i.e., Billiard (shown), Apple Bulldog, etc., is determined by the final shaping called Frazing.



Sanding - To get the perfectionsmooth finish you expect in a Kaywoodie, each pipe goes through 24 separate sanding operations.



Bit and Synchro Stem - Each Kaywoodie is fitted with the exclusive Drinkless Fitment that screens tars, moisture and other irritants; assures a smooth, easy draw, prevents clogging; strengthens the briar stem.

#### SERVICE AND REPAIR INFORMATION

New stems (bits) are individually custom-fitted to each pipe. New bowls are made from a virgin block of rare, Kaywoodie Briar. Please consider these facts in regard to

repair costs. Cost of new bit or bowl, depends upon price of pipe. Price is determined by checking name stamped on briar shank. If it is stamped "Super Grain" or "Standard" or "Flame Grain", etc., the re-tail price is shown in this catalog next to pipe illustration. Once the retail price is determined (i.e. a \$7.95 pipe) your replacement cost is found here (i.e. bowl for \$7.95 pipe costs \$3.98; bit costs \$2.20).



Staining-To accent the distinctive natural grain and coloring of Kaywoodie briar, the pipes are stained with pure vegetable color and hand rubbed for lustre.

#### What every pipe smoker should know...

Ask a hundred pipe smokers, and they will tell you that there is no smoke quite like a pipe. There is no smoke as relaxing, as satisfying, as warm and friendly as a pipe. They may even add that only with a pipe can you enjoy all the pleasures of smoking — without inhaling. On these things — more or less — all pipe smokers agree.

But ask that same one hundred men how to smoke a pipe and like as not you'll hear 100 different answers. The reason of course is that pipe smoking is highly personal and we all develop our own special ways of doing things.

Actually though, there are only two things you must do: Fill the pipe and light it.

While there is no great art to filling a pipe and lighting it, there are a few simple common sense truisms that will help you get used to a pipe faster, make it more enjoyable, and easier to keep it lit.

If you have never, or only occasionally, smoked a pipe, the first and most important ingredient is patience. Just as the first time you get behind the wheel of a new car or try a new food, it often takes a while to get used to it.

Smoking a pipe for the first time is very much like that. Experience shows that if you smoke a pipeful the first day ... two pipefuls each the second, third and fourth days ... and three pipefuls the fifth day — by the end of the week you'll be right in the swing of it. The important thing to remember is to stay with it. The enjoyment is well worth the short getting-used-to period. You'll soon discover that the longer you smoke a pipe — the more you'll enjoy it.

Keeping the pipe lit...

If you pack your pipe too tightly, there will not be enough air space. It will draw poorly and keep going out. If packed too loosely, it will burn fast and hot. Therefore: Not too loose, not too tight, but firm enough to draw easily; burn slowly and evenly.

Packing it in layers also helps. Put in some tobacco. Tamp it down, not too tightly now. Then add some more and tamp that down. Do this four or five times, until the pipe is filled. If the top layer is level, it is easier to get an even,

overall light.

If your pipe seems to continually go out, and you're sure that your pipe is not packed too tightly or your tobacco is not too damp, tamp your pipe down every so often, pressing the burned white ashes into the unsmoked tobacco. The secret is remembering to occasionally tamp down the white, burnt ash.

Another little trick to getting a good light is after using the first match, cover the pipe bowl with your lighter or closed book of matches and draw in (don't puff out) two or three times. Then use a second match and again cover the bowl and draw in. This will even out the conflagration that takes place with the first match, and draw the burning embers further into the bowl of tobacco.

The faster you puff on a pipe, the faster it will burn. Conversely, if you puff too slowly, it will go out. Try puffing in cadence with your breathing. When you breathe-in...puff. It's that simple.

#### Breaking in a new pipe

Fill it about a third full. Pack it a little looser than usual.

Smoke it to the bottom. Do this five or six times. Repeat this half full and three-quarters full so that the pipe will start caking from the bottom to the top.

Don't knock your pipe against hard surfaces. Either dig out ashes with a pipe tool, pencil, or penknife, or knock it out against the heel of your hand.

When the cake becomes more than \( \frac{1}{16} \) thick, scrape it out with a reamer (Kaywoodie makes a handsome reamer). Heat expands the carbon cake faster than the briar and could cause it to crack.

Without half trying, you can bite through substances much harder than a fine pipe bit made of rubber. Try not to bear down too hard on your bit. Always stand your pipe up when you're through with it. Don't lay it down. That way the juices will run into the bowl, not the bit.

Experienced smokers also recommend changing off from one pipe to another. This allows each pipe to properly cool and dry out and is a definite help in preserving its sweet smoking quality.

Taking the mystery out of Meerschaum

Block Meerschaum . . . the only rival of Kaywoodie Briar for sweetness of smoking.

When caravans from Asia Minor first brought Meerschaum to Europe, they claimed it was petrified Sea Foam; hence the German name "Meerschaum", meaning sea foam. Actually, Meerschaum is a white bone-like substance. It is not clay! It is organic in origin, coming from the fossilized remains of small, sea animals like coral. These tiny animals died millions of years ago and their remains were compressed by earthquakes, washed over by floods which deposited earth and rock on top of them.

Meerschaum is very light and porous. It is also very fragile and should be handled with extreme care.

Kaywoodie Meerschaum is mined in Turkey. It is usually found about 250 feet below the ground, embedded in red clay. After the big blocks of Meerschaum are dug out of the earth, its outside surfaces are cut away until a small kernel of sound Meerschaum is left. The decomposed outer parts are 10 to 20 times greater than the usable block kernel.

The blocks which are cut into Kaywoodie pipes are of all

sizes and usually of kidney shape. Only in Turkey do we find sufficient quantity and quality of Meerschaum suitable for Kaywoodie pipes. Since Kaywoodie is the largest pipe manufacturer in the world, we have first choice of the finest Block Meerschaum available from Turkey.

How to break-in a Kaywoodie Block Meerschaum . . . Kaywoodie Block Meerschaum is impregnated with a special wax compound, to help the pipe to
color. Removing this wax either by handling or rubbing
while smoking, will prevent proper coloring. Therefore, when
smoking, hold the pipe by the bit. Do not use chamois or
any other bowl covering.

The pipe should be smoked slowly and from the top down . . . exactly the opposite of breaking-in a Briar. First fill your Meerschaum to the top. Smoke it one-third down. Continue this until the upper third of the bowl begins to change color. Then smoke the pipe two thirds down until that part of the bowl also starts to color. Finally, you can smoke the entire bowlful.
